EVO On-line Entry - Login (shannonsportsit.ie)

An electronic entry application must be confirmed by way of personal signature by the competitor by the latest at administrative checks. The entry form must be accompanied by a copy of the valid competitor's licence. A change of competitor is permitted up to the close of entries. **Only the competitor entered in the event will be allowed to make this request**.

Queries to Event Secretary. Contact Details at Art 2.3

An entry application (also made electronically) will be accepted only if accompanied by the total entry fees. According to the International Sporting Code Art. 3.8.1 an entry compels the competitor to take part in the Competition in which they have been accepted to run, except in case of duly established Force Majeure.

Motorsport Ireland accepts an equivalence between National and International Licences issued by Motorsport Ireland (and Motorsport UK) for drivers and co-drivers. Competitors with licences issued by ASNs other than Motorsport Ireland and Motorsport UK, must hold an International licence of the appropriate grade.

Art. 4.3 Number of competitors accepted and vehicle classes

Art. 4.3.1 The number of competitors shall be limited to: 160 (excluding historic and juniors). No more than 25 historic cars will start at the beginning of Leg 2, no more than 25 junior cars will start at the beginning of Leg 3.)

In the event of an excess of 160 entries being received the following criteria will be applied to all entries received from the opening to the closing date of entries.

- A. Previous winners of the Donegal International Rally
- B. Previous winners of the Irish Tarmac Rally Championship
- C. Previous winners of the MI National Rally Championship
- D. Up to 10 Entries allocated at Organiser's discretion.
- E. Up to 8 Entries allocated to overseas crew.
- F. Up to 25 entries allocated to D.M.C. members using Club criteria applied.
- G. Finishing in the first 15 in a World Championship Rally.
- H. Finishing in the first 5 in Class in a World Championship Rally.
- I. Finishing in the first 10 in a European Championship Rally.
- J. Finishing in the first 5 in class in a European Championship Rally.
- K. The first 5 overall in the 2022 Irish Tarmac Rally Championship at closing date for entries.
- L. The first 3 in class in the 2022 Irish Tarmac Rally Championship at closing date for entries.
- M. Finishing in the first 15 overall in any International Rally.
- N. Finishing in the first 3 overall on National section of International rally.
- O. Finishing First in Class only on previous year's Donegal International Rally.
- P. Up to 20 Donegal Motor Club members finishing in the first 20 overall selected in the order of

(1) an International Rally, (2) a

National section of an International Rally (3), a National Stages rally,

- Q. Finishing in the first 20 overall in a National Section of an International Rally.
- R. Finishing first 3 in Class on an International Rally including National Section.
- S. Finishing in the first 3 in class in any National Stages Rally.
- T. Finishing in the first 20 overall on any other Stage Rally.
- U. Any other Speed Event.

Results from 1st Jan. 2019 to closing date of entries to count except in relation to (A) above.

Category (B)) & (C) entries apply to winners in the 10 years prior to 1st January 2022.

To qualify under (G) of criteria, the highest 25 eligible crews accumulating points within the DMC new points system at 1st May 2022

In category (P) Donegal Motor Club members shall be those holding continuous membership of Donegal Motor Club Limited since at least 2020.

Only results attained by the driver as a driver will be taken into consideration.

The onus will rest with the competitor to provide documentary proof of results stated if requested to do so by the organisers.

Any false declaration of results will result in the entry in question being placed at the end of the list.

Names of drivers given discretionary entries will be disclosed by the organisers if they are requested to do so.

Claims on an Entry Form relating to the above will be subject to verification by the selection committee.

Art. 4.3.2 Eligible National Cars

Nationally homologated cars may participate in this rally when they fit into a national group/class as of following list, without eligibility to score Trophy points.

Cars in classes 9-15, class 20 and class 23 will compete for the Donegal International National Rally Cup.

Cars in classes 17-19 will compete for the Donegal International Historic Rally Cup.

Cars in class 16 will compete for the Donegal International Junior Rally Cup.

Cars in classes 22, 24 and 25 will only be included in overall classification and are eligible for overall awards.

- Class 9. Modified cars up to 1450cc 2 wheel drive.
- Class 10. Modified cars 1451cc to 1650cc not more than 2 valves per cylinder, 2 wheel drive.
- Class 11F. Modified FWD cars 1451cc to 1650cc more than 2 valves per cylinder.
- Class 11R. Modified RWD cars 1451cc to 1650cc more than 2 valves per cylinder.
- Class 12. Modified cars 1651cc to 2100cc not more than 2 valves per cylinder, 2 wheel drive.
- Class 13. Modified cars 1651cc to 2100cc more than 2 valves per cylinder, 2 wheel drive.
- Class 14. Modified cars 2101cc to 3500cc, 2 wheel drive. (Max 2 valves per cylinder over 3000cc actual capacity).
- Class 15. Four-wheel drive cars whose homologation has expired.
- **Class 16.** For cars complying to the Class 16 technical regulations published on the Motorsport Ireland website where the driver is under 26 years of age on Jan 1st of the year in which the event takes place.
- Class 17. Historic cars up to 1600cc. See Appendix 29.1, Article 18.2. of current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.
- Class 18. Historic cars over 1600cc. See Appendix 29.1, Article 18.2. of current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.
- Class 19. FIA Appendix K.
- Class 20. Modified 4 Wheel Drive Cars.
- **Class 22.** For cars whose homologation expired on Dec 31st 2004 and do not meet the criteria laid out in Art. 2.7.1.c of the FIA International Sporting Code. WRC cars are not eligible for this class. See Appendix 29.1, Article 13 of current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.
- Class 23. Novice Class See Appendix 29.1, Article 23 As per the technical regulations published on the Motorsport Ireland website.
- Class 24. R5/Rally2 cars converted from left hand drive to right hand drive. All other components must comply with the cars homologation.
- Class 25. WRC Cars (1.6T & 2.0T), including those converted from left hand drive to right hand drive. All other components must comply with the cars homologation. Cars in this class must meet the criteria laid out in Art. 2.7.1.c of the FIA International Sporting Code.

Historic competitors in classes 17, 18 & 19 will start the event at start of Leg 2 TC I Parc Fermé Out. Class 16 Juniors competitors will start the event at the start of Leg 3 TC Q Parc Fermé Out.

Art. 4.6 Entry fee refunds

The entry fee shall be refunded in full

- if the event does not take place
- to teams whose entry application is rejected

The organiser may partially refund entry fees, if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure.

Art. 5. Insurance Cover

Motorsport Ireland licence holders MUST hold current IRDS cover, valid for 2022, in order to be permitted to start the event. All other licence holders MUST hold current BRDS Insurance Cover, valid for 2022 in order to be permitted to start the event.

The Motorsport Ireland Insurance Database Listing published and updated weekly on www.motorsportireland.com is the ONLY proof that valid IRDS/BRDS is held by a competitor.

Each Co-Driver not in possession of their own IRDS/BRDS must sign a declaration stating that at no time during the event, will he/she drive the competing car.

IRDS/BRDS Cover will commence on arrival at Scrutiny Out Control before Parc Fermé In control on Thursday 16th of June 2022.

- (a) Cover only exists while travelling the Official Route, i.e. via the Road Book during the course of the competition and while under the control of the Organisers.
- (b) Cover will cease on arrival at the Final Parc Fermé In Control TC Y or at the point where the competitor(s) retire from the Event.

The Organisers decline liability in any accident caused by or to competitors and the competing cars during the whole of the event. The Organisers also decline any liability for breach of the laws and regulations of the countries covered by the rally. Competitors shall be held entirely responsible for any accident or breach of laws in which they may be involved and shall declare to the Organisers particulars from any accident from which liability may arise and shall indemnify the organisers in regard to any liability. An entrant or driver(s) shall have no claims against the Organisers arising out of any action of the Organisers, their servants or officials, during the course of the rally.

Art 6.1 Obligatory organiser's advertising

Rally plate: Number and Event/Sposor Logo

Competition number size: 50 x 50 cm including Sponsor Advertising.

The organiser will provide each crew with the number identification (50x50cm), which must be affixed to their car in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. Each panel shall be placed horizontally at the leading edge of each front door, with the number at the front. The top of the plate shall be between 7 cm and 10 cm below the lower limit of the window. **It is not allowed to cut the panel.**

Art. 7. Tyres

Art. 7.1 Regulations regarding tyres which may be used during the rally

Art. 13 of the FIA RRSR's (tyres and wheels) will apply to competitors in classes RC2 to RC5, 24 and 25. All other cars must comply with Motorsport Ireland tyre regulations. The hand cutting of tyres is permitted but must be in accordance with the patterns submitted by the tyre manufacturer to the FIA.

Art. 8. Fuel

All types of fuel must follow Appendix J Art. 252. Art 9. (RRSR Art. 62). See Art 12.7 regarding Refuelling Zone.

Art. 9. Reconnaissance of Special Stages

Reconnaissance will be according to FIA RRSR Art. 35. The schedule for the reconnaissance is published in Appendix 2 of these supplementary regulations.

Art. 9.1 Registration procedure

Details of the reconnaissance car and occupants, including address and telephone numbers at which they can be contacted during the reconnaissance period, must be submitted to the organisers at recce registration at the Rally Office. A Recce Registration form will need to be completed by all competitors. If the crew making a reconnaissance wish to change the car or vary the occupants, a new Recce Registration form will need to be completed.

Each car must be identified with a reconnaissance car number supplied by the organiser. Rally cars used in the event may not be used for reconnaissance.

- (a). Competitors must sign on each day between 08.30 to 11.00 at rally headquarters.
- (b). Competitors must declare the make, model and registration number of the car that they will be using for reconnaissance. All recce cars must comply with FIA RRSR Art. 35.
- (c). Entrant Decals supplied by the organisers, must be displayed clearly on the windscreen of the car during the reconnaissance period. These plates must be returned to the Secretary before 09.30 on 17th June 2022. Fine of €100.00 for non-return.
- (d). Any competitor found on a special stage without having registered as above, or in breach of these registration regulations, will not be permitted to start the rally.

Art. 9.2 Specific regulations

During reconnaissance, all national traffic regulation must be followed, including but not limited to the speed limits. Please note that the Special Stages will not be closed to public traffic during reconnaissance. The organizer may reduce the allowed speed individually by marking the areas in the road book and along the route. Speeding during reconnaissance and/or shakedown will be penalised according to FIA RRSR Article 34.2.

Art. 9.3 Number of Passages

The maximum number of passages authorised for each crew on each special stage is three.

Art. 11.4 Drivers' safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Front Head Restraint) intended to be used, e.g. HANS devices, must be presented for scrutineering. They shall be checked for compliance with Appendix L, Chapter III.

Art. 11.5 Noise Level.

Cars must comply with Motorsport Ireland regulations - Appendix 2. Art 9

Art. 11.6 Special National Requirements

Competitors in the National classes 9 to 25 must comply with the technical regulations contained in Appendix 2 and Appendix 29.1 of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.

Art. 11.7 Installation of the Safety Tracking System

Art. 12.4 Start procedure on Special Stages

The electronic start procedure is as follows:

Start Intervals will be 30 seconds.

Start Time is issued by Start Timekeeper

30 seconds before start, RED Light shows on Start Board,

15 seconds before start, RED Light and 5 Amber Countdown Lights show on Start Board

5 seconds to 0 seconds Amber Countdown Lights reduce by 1 every second

START is GREEN Light.

Finish is determined by competitor breaking a beam whilst travelling over the Finish Line. The Finish Time is automatically transmitted to the STOP Car where the Finish Time will be Issued.

Art. 12.5 Super Special Stage, regulations, and order

There will be NO Super Special Stage.

Art. 12.6 Tyre Warming Zone (TWZ)

There will be NO Tyre Warming Zones according to Art. 44.4 of the RRSR.

Art. 12.7 Refuelling

Art. 12.7.1 Refuelling is only allowed in Refuelling Zone (RZ) and commercial fuel station. To refuel in the service park is forbidden at any time.

Art. 12.7.2 To access a Refuelling Zone, all personnel involved in refuelling operations must wear clothing that provides adequate protection against fire and includes at least: long trousers, long-sleeved top, closed shoes, gloves and a balaclava.

Art. 12.7.3 Environmental Mat in a Refuelling Zone (RZ)

The requirement of protecting the ground with an Environmental Mat, which shall be composed of an absorbent upper part and an impermeable lower part, is assigned to the competitors.

Art. 12.8 Finish procedures and other activities after the finish of the rally

Art. 12.8.1 Finish Ramp will be at Rally HQ and attending cars may be held at a holding control nearby. Details in Roadbook and amendments by Bulletin if necessary.

Art. 12.8.2 Availability of participants

Participants who park their vehicles in the Parc Fermé upon passing the finish line, must remain available by phone (mobile) until the final classification has been posted.

Art. 12.8.3 Classification

The final classification will not be distributed after the event. The final classification will be published on the event website and on the Digital Notice Board via the Sportity App.

- (d). Abandon, cancel, or postpone the competition in the case of unforeseen circumstances.
- (e). Delete or amend any part of the route, competition, or time requirements in the case of unforeseen circumstances.
- (f). Distribute the awards at their discretion, if through unforeseen circumstances the competition is stopped before its scheduled completion.
- (g). Reduce the number of awards in any class.
- (h). Exclude any person or car appearing on examination to be ineligible for the competition or the class therein, to which the entry refers.
- (i). Before the start of the competition offer the entrant of any person or car liable to exclusion under Paragraph (h) above the option to transfer to the appropriate class.
- (j). Publish an instruction, which will have the force of these regulations. Such instructions will be displayed on the official notice board or at a control and will be signed by the Clerk of the Course or his deputies.
- (k). Exclude a competitor from the rally and refuse his application for entry for the following 3 years for contravention of Article 9.
- (m). Appoint Judges of Fact to determine whether or not the requirements of these regulations have been complied with. In particular, these judges will be empowered to determine whether a competitor has followed the correct route, and /or travelled at an excessive speed, and or caused an excessive noise and /or obeyed instructions concerning servicing and service areas. RE-START AFTER RETIRING ON LEG 1: 12.11.2

A crew retiring from the rally between Parc Fermé Out and Arrival Control SS3, may restart the rally from Service Out Control after 3 stages, or from Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control on Saturday morning (subject to compliance with 12.11.10.1 below).

Cars retiring from the rally on Special Stages 2 or 3, or the following road sections, may restart from Service Out Control after 4 or 6 stages, or from Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control on Saturday morning (subject to compliance with 12.11.10.1 below).

Cars retiring from the rally on Special Stages 3, 4, 5, 6 or the following road sections, may restart from Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control on Saturday morning (subject to compliance with 12.11.10.1 below).

Cars retiring from the rally on Special Stages 6, 7, 8 or the following road sections, may restart from Service Out Control after Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control on Saturday morning (subject to compliance with 12.11.10.1 below).

If they are unable to re-start at Service Out Control after 3 stages they must have their car in Parc Fermé not later than 22.30 hours on Friday night. They may then restart, subject to passing scrutiny, on Leg 2 at Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control (Saturday morning) if they are to continue to be classified in overall results.

Notwithstanding the above, a crew retiring from the rally during Leg 1 is entitled to not attempt any of the stages during Leg 2. In this case they must have their car in Parc Fermé not later than 22.30 hours on Saturday night. They may then restart, subject to passing scrutiny, on Leg 3 at Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control (Sunday morning) if they are to continue to be classified in overall results (subject to compliance with 12.11.10.1 below).

RESTART AFTER RETIRING ON LEG 2: 12.11.3

A crew retiring from the rally between Parc Fermé Out (Saturday morning) and Arrival Control SS9, may restart the rally from Service Out Control after 9 stages,, from Service Out Control after 12 stages or from Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control on Sunday morning (subject to compliance with 12.11.10.1 below).

Cars retiring from the rally on Special Stages 9, 10, 11 or the following road sections, may restart from Service Out Control after 12 stages, or from Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control on Sunday morning (subject to compliance with 12.11.10.1 below).

Cars retiring from the rally on Special Stages 12, 13, 14 or the following road sections, may restart from Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control on Sunday morning (subject to compliance with 12.11.10.1 below).

Donegal International Rally

If they are unable to re-start at Service Out Control after Special Stages 9 or 12 they must have their car in Parc Fermé not later than 22.30 hours on Saturday night. They may then restart, subject to passing scrutiny, on Leg 3 at Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control (Sunday morning) if they are to continue to be classified in overall results (subject to compliance with 12.11.10.1 below).

RESTART AFTER RETIRING ON LEG 3: 12.11.4

A crew retiring from the rally between Parc Fermé Out (Sunday morning) and Arrival Control SS17, may only restart the rally from Service Out Control after 17 stages (subject to compliance with 12.11.10.1 below).

No restart will be permitted for crews retiring on Stages 17, 18, 19 or 20.

The above re-start procedure on Legs 2 and 3 will also be made available as appropriate to the Historic and Junior Classes with the following relevant sections applying to all classes throughout the event.

A restart will not be permitted where a crew has been excluded for non-compliance with eligibility requirements, traffic violations or a decision of the COC / Super Rally Co-Ordinator.

On retirement the crew must hand in their time cards to Car Accountability or the marshal/timekeeper at the next available location/Time Control.

Crews must retain the duplicate copy of the time card, to present to SRC as proof of stages completed.

- **12.11.5** Competitors must register for Super Rally if they wish to restart by contacting the SRC prior to a time that will be specified in Final Instructions. Service Vehicles will not be permitted to access the Stage or any closed road between runs. The organisers will, where possible, endeavour to remove any car to the nearest location where it can exit the stage. The transport of the car from that location is the responsibility of the competitor. The car must return by direct route to the Service Area.
- **12.11.6** Competitors availing of the Super Rally must present themselves at the appropriate Out Control, with their car, for re-scrutiny. Due time is 10 minutes before their original due time at that Control, and 15 Minutes maximum lateness will apply.
- **12.11.7** The SRC, once satisfied that the crew meets the conditions for a restart, will issue new time cards which will have a restart time and restart Control Number.

The restart position within the field shall be at the discretion of the COC / SRC.

12.11.8 The organisers reserve the right to disallow restart on safety grounds or if the restart would interfere with the running of the rally.

12.11.9 Penalties:

12.1.9.1 Super Rally Penalties will be applied as per Article 13.5, Appendix 29 of the Motorsport Ireland Yearbook 2022 (as published on MI Website)

12.11.10 Award Eligibility:

12.11.10.1 In order to be classified as a finisher the crew must complete a minimum of 10 special stages (or 50% of the total number of stages for Historic and Junior Classes), which must include the final loop of stages and the finish control. **12.11.10.2** Crews completing the rally under Super Rally regulations will be eligible to score points in Championships.

Art. 12.12 Bogey Times

Bogey times will be enforced as per Motorsport Ireland GCR 22.2.1 The maximum required average speed for loose surface stages shall not be more than 113 kph and for tarmac stages 130kph, as per GCR Chapter 2, Rule 22.2.1.

Otherwise he will forfeit his award.

The organisers shall have absolute discretion accept or reject any such claim, and in cases of doubt may call for proof in support of any claim. Any claim deemed to be false will entail exclusion.
